**ROLE TITLE:** Assistant Coach

**ROLE INTRO:** The Assistant Coach should be a positive role model responsible for creating a positive learning environment supporting mainly primary school aged children to learn fundamental skills, sportsmanship and teamwork in cricket.

**RESPONSIBLE TO:** Lead Coach

**RESPONSIBILITIES AND MAIN DUTIES:**

- Assistant with fundamental skills development, teamwork and sportsmanship
- Be on time at all practices and games
- Provide a safe environment for practice and games by checking the condition of practice area and equipment each day
- Make sure player and parents know the correct policies and rules for club
- Inform first aider when injuries occur and document incidents
- Report any problems with fields, equipment, player behaviour, or parent behaviour to those responsible
